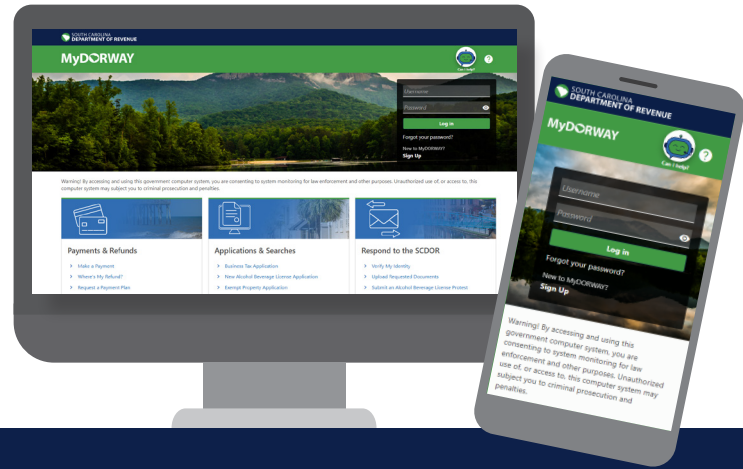

INSTRUCTIONS

Decals are non-refundable, non-transferable, and valid through May 31, 2026.

Proration is available for newly-acquired machines or out-of-service machines you are placing back into service. The rate is based on the month the machine goes into service.

- You may also be required to apply for a license from the county or city where your machine is located.
- You must affix your decals to machines in a visible location so that no one can remove them.
- You will be charged a penalty if:
 - Any machine does not have a current decal affixed.
 - Owner/Operator information is not posted in a visible location on each machine.

MACHINE TYPE DEFINITIONS

For more information on the different machine types, see SC Code Section 12-21-2720(1-3) at dor.sc.gov/policy.

Type I:

- Coin-operated kiddie rides, mechanical amusement devices, juke boxes, and machines for playing music
- Billiard or pocket billiard tables
- Foosball tables
- Bowling lane tables
- Skee-ball tables

Type II:

- Machines for entertainment or video games
- Crane machines
- Pinball machines with flippers

Type III:

- In-line pinball machines without levers or flippers

RELEVANT SC CODE SECTIONS

Section 12-21-2710: Machines used for gambling are strictly prohibited. Violations are a misdemeanor, which can result in fines of up to \$500, up to one year in jail, or both.

Section 12-21-2718: You must maintain records showing the manufacturer's serial number, model, or type of machine.

Section 12-21-2724: The SCDOR assumes that you buy licenses only for legal machines. If the machines are later found to be illegal, you will not receive a refund for License Tax fees.

Section 12-21-2736: If you purchase a license for an illegal machine, that does not make it legal.

Section 12-21-2748: You must attach a sticker with information about the owner or operator of the machine to each machine.

Section 12-21-2750: You must keep information about any machine lease agreements on the premises.

Social Security Privacy Act Disclosure

It is mandatory that you provide your Social Security Number on this tax form if you are an individual taxpayer. 42 U.S.C. 405(c)(2)(C)(i) permits a state to use an individual's Social Security Number as means of identification in administration of any tax. SC Regulation 117-201 mandates that any person required to make a return to the SCDOR must provide identifying numbers, as prescribed, for securing proper identification. Your Social Security Number is used for identification purposes.
