SCOPE:

An Information Letter is a temporary document issued for the purpose of disseminating general tax information and to respond to technical questions from within the Commission which are not related to a specific set of facts.

In response to the destruction caused by Hurricane Andrew in Florida and Hurricane Iniki in Hawaii, the Tax Commission is providing relief to taxpayers who have businesses in South Carolina with offices in Florida or Hawaii whose operations have been affected by the hurricanes.

Affected taxpayers may be eligible for the following relief as a result of the hurricanes:

- 1. Extensions of time to file tax returns and pay taxes.
- 2. Suspension of the enforced collection of any assessed liability of the taxpayer.
- 3. Waiver of any penalties due as a result of any extensions, or suspension of collection activities granted by the Commission.
- 4. Replacement copies of tax returns, free of charge, for tax returns destroyed as a result of the hurricanes.

Other relief may be available depending on the taxpayer's particular circumstances and will be considered on a case by case basis.
