SCOPE:

An Information Letter is a document issued for the purpose of disseminating general information or information concerning an

administrative pronouncement.

Information Letters issued to disseminate general information have no precedential value and do not represent the official position of the

Department. Information Letters designed as administrative pronouncements represent the official advisory opinion of the

Department.

The South Carolina Department of Revenue is providing relief to taxpayers who have businesses in South Carolina with offices in Georgia whose operations have been affected by the flood and to those taxpayers whose returns are prepared by tax professionals affected by the flood.

Affected taxpayers may be eligible for the following relief as a result of the flood:

- 1. Extensions of time to file tax returns and pay taxes.
- 2. Suspension of the enforced collection of any assessed liability of the taxpayer.

- 3. Waiver of any penalties due as a result of any extensions, or suspension of collection activities granted by the Department of Revenue.
- 4. Replacement copies of tax returns, free of charge, for tax returns destroyed as a result of the flood.

Other relief may be available depending on the taxpayer's particular circumstances and will be considered on a case by case basis.
