SCOPE: An Information Letter is a written statement issued to the public to

announce general information useful in complying with the laws administered by the Department. An Information Letter has no

precedential value.

A number of South Carolina income, sales and use, and property tax incentives require jobs associated with the incentive to meet certain state or county per capita personal income requirements to determine qualification for, or the amount of, the particular incentive (e.g., the job tax credit under Code Section 12-6-3360, the sales and use tax exemption for computer equipment for technology intensive facilities under Code Section 12-36-2120(65), and the personal property corporate headquarters credit under Code Section 12-6-3410).

The county per capita income figures are generally published in November. The state figures are generally published in March and September. In order to aid taxpayers in determining whether the per capita income requirements of an incentive have been met, the Department publishes both the county and state per capita income amounts each year when it receives the figures from the South Carolina Board of Economic Advisors. Below are the most recent figures.
